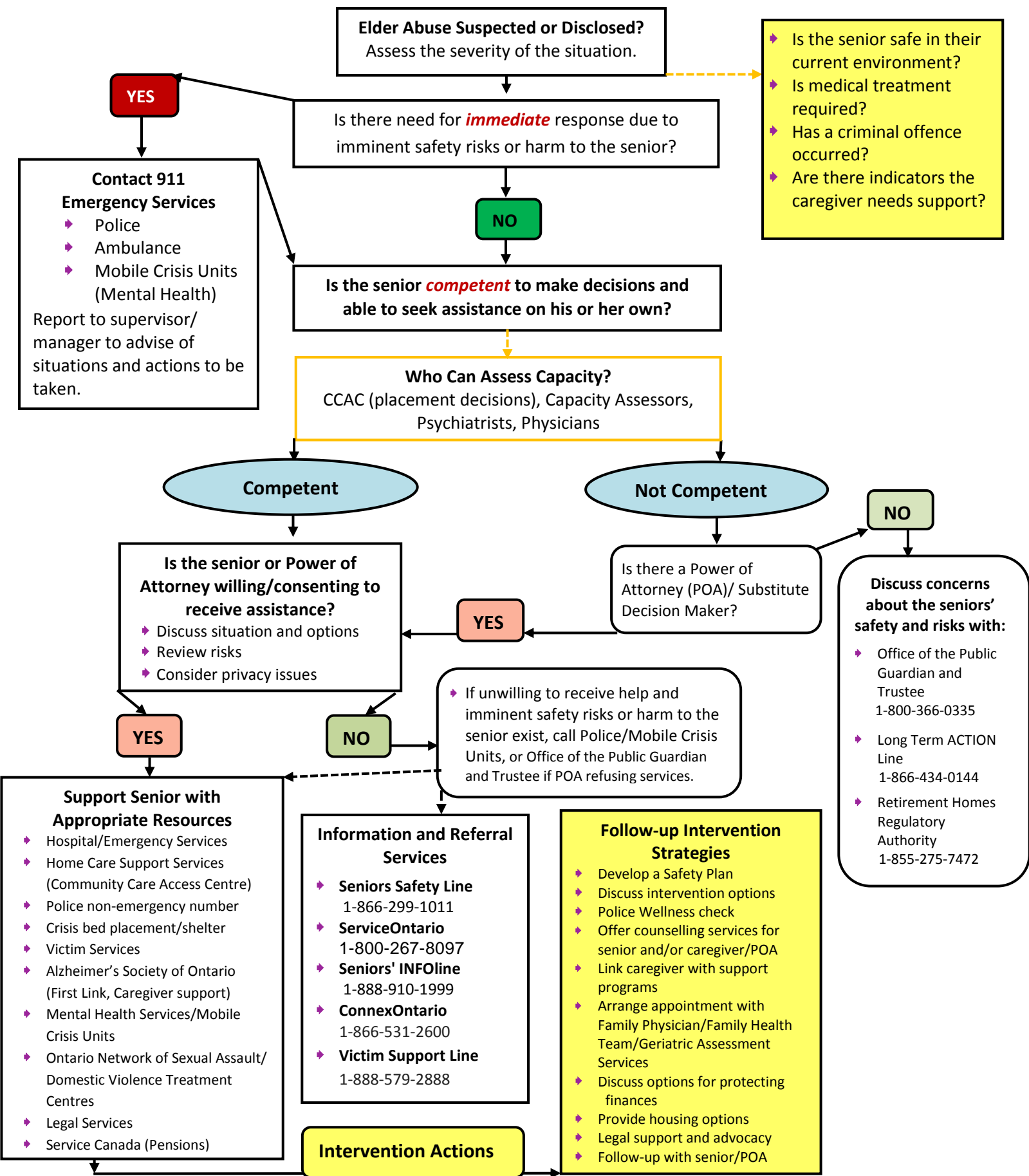




Elder Abuse Screening, Intervention and Response Guide for Health Care Providers



Elder Abuse Suspected or Disclosed?
Assess the severity of the situation.

- ◆ Is the senior safe in their current environment?
- ◆ Is medical treatment required?
- ◆ Has a criminal offence occurred?
- ◆ Are there indicators the caregiver needs support?

YES

Is there need for **immediate** response due to imminent safety risks or harm to the senior?

Contact 911 Emergency Services

- ◆ Police
- ◆ Ambulance
- ◆ Mobile Crisis Units (Mental Health)

Report to supervisor/manager to advise of situations and actions to be taken.

Is the senior **competent** to make decisions and able to seek assistance on his or her own?

Who Can Assess Capacity?
CCAC (placement decisions), Capacity Assessors, Psychiatrists, Physicians

Competent

Not Competent

Is the senior or Power of Attorney willing/consenting to receive assistance?

- ◆ Discuss situation and options
- ◆ Review risks
- ◆ Consider privacy issues

◆ If unwilling to receive help and imminent safety risks or harm to the senior exist, call Police/Mobile Crisis Units, or Office of the Public Guardian and Trustee if POA refusing services.

Is there a Power of Attorney (POA)/ Substitute Decision Maker?

Intervention Actions

Follow-up Intervention Strategies

- ◆ Develop a Safety Plan
- ◆ Discuss intervention options
- ◆ Police Wellness check
- ◆ Offer counselling services for senior and/or caregiver/POA
- ◆ Link caregiver with support programs
- ◆ Arrange appointment with Family Physician/Family Health Team/Geriatric Assessment Services
- ◆ Discuss options for protecting finances
- ◆ Provide housing options
- ◆ Legal support and advocacy
- ◆ Follow-up with senior/POA
